

Public external debt of low-income countries to non-Paris Club creditors grew significantly in the last decade.



The forum will explore a range of pressing issues, pivotal to shaping a sustainable and equitable global future:


- Economic Architecture and Debt Solutions: Discussions will delve into global economic systems, emphasizing sustainable debt management and financial reforms to enhance economic resilience.
